1/16 Declaration of interest: None

2/16 Parish Council Standing Orders were suspended to allow members of the public to make comments and representations for a period of 15 minutes. There were none

3/16 Adoption of the minutes from the previous meeting. Proposed by Cllr Hull Seconded by Cllr Robinson. All in favour

5/16 Planning PA/2019/1680 Planning permission for the installation of field drainage to support the construction of the Hornsea project

Resolved: No objections raised

6/16 North Lincolnshire councillor's reports. Cllr Clark, Cllr Hannigan and Cllr Wells and high way officer with Cllr Evans met to discuss village issues. Cllr Wells would like support with forthcoming energy into fuel plans, this will not be an incinerator. Cllr Wells agreed East Halton Rd variable speed limits not suitable.

7/16 Chair's report. Thanked volunteers for cleaning CC saved Parish approx. £1600, Thanks to Volunteers for Halloween help, reciprocated by councillors to Cllr Coxon and Cllr Hesketh for the new fencing. Voluntary offer gratefully received from RM to decorate CC, as a retired painter and decorator. Cllr Evans suggests she will ask Phillips 66 for 20 litres, filling and masking tape approx. £100 in value. All agreed.

8/16 Delegate's reports. CAG no meeting, AIRPORT no rep, KCB nothing to report, NATs no meeting. ERNLLCA no rep, HWRA grant ideas shared, Clerk asked to contact Anthia Taylor for electoral fees as Sth Killingholme lowest charge for room in area. Orsted grant too complicated for one person. Cllr Wells says don't forget Hornsea grant.

Nov. Monday 11th 10am informal meeting agreed to discuss grants.

12/16 Community Centre

- I. Entrance Wall, waiting for weather to break for work to commence.
- II. Caretaker vacancy. Happy with voluntary service at present.
- III. Tots Garden area grant. Play leader recording numbers of attendance presently which will impact on grant funding.
- IV. Shed repairs, guttering, car parking repairs, gates now shutting and locked, Cllr Wells suggest we log each time lock is broken, Cllr Coxon recommends another more secure lock, large fence put up. Indoor decorating; paint for decorating discussed.
- V. Use of community centre for Wi-Fi and old computer by the public to source job applications, DWP use as recommended by ERNLLCA. Monday mornings. Cllr K. Hesketh investigating job club possibility. Nth Killingholme council will be asked too for access their support. Advice sought from job centre Immingham. Cllr J. Hesketh recommends Phillips 66 donate some old lap tops, Cllr Evans will ask.

13/16 Police matters: Neighbour has been told by female police officer community centre has been closed down.

14/16 Parish matters.

- I. Cllr Price had difficulties with Halloween week. Call for more councillor's help setting up and closing. Cllr K. Hesketh asks for more help when events are on in respect of money the volunteers are saving cleaning. Decorating for Christmas, to put on next agenda.
- II. Light in Pilgrims close not bright enough, Cllr Price wheels family member in wheelchair in dark. Cllr Clark stated St Deny's close was assessed and prioritised, waiting for refit of LED upgrade, 24,000 lighting units will be rolled out. He suggested clerk write to Mike Brown in the interest of safety and security please prioritise.
- III. Cllr Robinson reminded council brick snicket St Deny's to Greengate too dark. Cllr Evans reported this already.
- IV. Village signs. Cllr K. Hesketh said Nth Lincs Council paid for Nth Killingholme's sign. Need a design for the form. Clerk to produce design; coloured image of Mayflower for sign.
- V. Emergency Plan. Input of Janet Kelly? All agreed.
- VI. Pilgrim 400 anniversary celebrations. To coincide with June 13th 2020 Mayflower Celebration Day in Immingham. Linking with Immingham Town Council Celebrations. We have a shared history, many documents mention departure point as Sth Killingholme Creek. Discussed where the Pilgrims met in Sth Killingholme South, to research more information.
- VII. Newsletter/Magazine, ideas for content. Visiting services from Roxton. Include adverts.
- VIII. Benches. Nothing on bench to say who it belongs to. Teak oil it and put up end of School Rd green area. Clerk to write to give Nth Lincs Council giving 3 weeks' notice of intentions on advice of Cllr Wells. To be placed in spring.
- IX. Community Speed watch. No volunteers.
- X. Ward councillor/village visit and walk around, feedback from Cllr Evans; reported Greengate, East field lane, Faulding Lane speeding; no action taken as low numbers Nth Lincs suggest using speed watch. Trees all the trees are programmed to be crown lifted in village. Ash Dieback disease an issue in NE Lincs, Cllr Clark suggests to contact tree officer. Cllr Evans. Ongo have been approached about hedges, Nth Lincs will approach them. Pot holes reported again. Greengate one; not deep enough yet. Pot hole teams have been working in Mayflower. A160 responsibility of highways dept. Asset team investigating Mayflower close to be re-laid as sinking. Trucks still parking illegally; reported. Nth Lincs will try and empty bins more often in layby. Parking enforcement had been out to Eastfield Rd further to happen. Parking on A160 is Police issue not council matter. Bigger give way

signs requested on Top rd. can't do a stop sign. Footpaths in village ongoing programme. St Denys Cllr Clark already fed back. Electricity cover reported again by Cllr Wells. When they are sorted they will let parish council know.

Cllr J. Hesketh asked why other councillors were not invited to meeting. Discussion; Cllr Evans does most of reporting. Nth Lincs Councillors requested just Cllr Evans be present. Clarified Cllr K. Hesketh does report issues too. Cllr Evans suggests the portal online evidences reports, anyone can send a report. Cllr Wells suggests the ward councillors will come out if a letter is sent to Nth Lincs Council.

- XI. Query around proposed bus service from Nth Killingholme to Habrough Station? Cllr Wells suggested not factual, not at the moment, looked at it but no support from NE Lincs. There are more trains now.
