

Minutes of the Meeting of South Killingholme Parish Council held on Monday 6th September 2021, commencing at 6.30pm at the Community Centre Moat Lane Sth. Killingholme.

1. **Apologies:** Cllr L. Oldfield and Ward Cllr D. Wells
2. **Declaration of interest:** None declared
3. Parish Council Standing Orders are suspended to allow members of the public and press to make comments and representations for a period of 15 minutes. Resident of village neighbouring small field expressed disappointment with council for not cutting Cllr F. Coxon to maintain it.
4. **Adoption of the minutes** from the previous meeting. Cllr Evans proposed, Cllr Hull seconded. All in favour
5. **Matters arising from the minutes.**
6. **Ward Councillors updates:** None presented in person, e-mail or letter. It was requested the Clerk write to Nth Lincs Council to express disappointment in level of engagement.
7. **Bi-Monthly meetings.** Cllr Hull proposed to return to monthly meetings, 7 in favour 2 against. Carried

 - II. Victim Support donation? Discussion and proposal by Cllr Ulliott to donate £100, seconded by Cllr K. Hesketh. None in favour as it was felt it was public money and unethical to donate.
 - III. Volunteer Hub/Walking Group/Knit and natter. Discussed. 23rd Sept mentioned by Cllr Evans, Clerk to investigate.
9. **Financial matters:**
 - I. Bank Reconciliation. New tin bought for maintenance of CC. All in favour to accept
 - II. Income and expenditure for July and Aug. Football season started Sept charges apply for league matches. Super strikers to contact clerk still. To accept, all in favour.
 - III. Bar Licence ratify payment £180. All in favour
 - IV. Ratify transfer to Valda energy. All in favour
10. **Planning**
 - I. Baptist Chapel Planning: PA/2021/233 and PA/2021/1140 No objections Hull proposed Price seconded, all in favour.
 - II. Environment and Planning Committee members to elect. This can be interested members of the public with councillors. It was felt unnecessary as little planning.

 - I. Alarm and CCTV updates. Still chasing quotes.
 - II. Hedges nearest gate on small field. Needs cutting back to the fence. Cllr Coxon and Cllr K. Hesketh volunteered to cut it.
 - III. Fascia's update. No quotes forthcoming.
 - IV. Small field plans update. Woodland Trust dropping trees off November. Volunteers requested.
 - V. Memorial plaques update. Clerk to contact Methodist again
 - VI. Plumbing issues update. Thank you to KCB for financially supplying and Cllr Coxon for helping to install new hand washing sink unit in kitchen.
 - VII. Bar/pop up pub pool night. Save up for Speakers and Lights. Discussion on pop up pub prices. Prices would have to rise if staff were paid and for outside functions. Double prices motioned by Cllr J Hesketh D Evans seconded, 8 in favour double Cllr K. Hesketh against.
 - VIII. Charge free for first night incentive. Discussion; Cllr K. Hesketh proposed newly formed group/club get first session free if benefitting the village Cllr Price seconded. All in favour.

- IX. Internal and external door repainting. Cllr Evans proposed and Cllr Robinson seconded, All in favour. Cllr K. Hesketh proposed internal doors repainted £50-60 estimate Cllr K. Hesketh and Cllr F. Coxon volunteered to carry out work. Cllr J. Hesketh ladies toilet door needs doing at same time. Sage/willow green proposed. Cllr Robinson proposed to accept, Cllr F. Coxon seconded. All in favour.
- X. Small field old park gates and slide to scrap and replace with new Covid memorial gate. All in favour of grant application and contacting scrap merchants. Cllr P. Hull to seek quotes for a decorative, Covid memorial gate, Cllr K. Hesketh to contact scrap merchants.
- XI. Repaint front gates. Revisit Spring 2022

12. Parish matters.

- I. Members on outside organisations feedback. ERNLLCA no feedback, Philips 66; shutdown 6 weeks end of this month; steam noise is a chip in stack, will be new year before fixed, apologies from Phillips 66, 10th Dec pantomime and Senior Citizens funded and arranged by Phillips 66, VANL community network; prescribing team with Re-evolution bikes coming, need names by 22nd Sept.
- II. Maintenance in village. Big thank you to Fred CC down spouts, ivy, seats in village. Mutual Aid donation of £200 to be returned although we were beneficiaries and clerk/ Cllr Oldfield/ other volunteers able to claim petrol for shopping delivered to vulnerable residents. Discussion; use for painting of CC. Footpaths, verges, roads pot holes; Cllr Evans stated some pot holes and some paths had been filled, weeds coming through already. Habrough Rd will be done soon, machine on site. Phillips 66 promised dog bin for other side of village. Cllr K. Hesketh and to view another bench for refurbishment; discussion put other side of bridge near boxes.
- III. Donation of sweets/gifts for Halloween/Christmas competitions. Cllr K. Hesketh donating £10 from own purse.
- IV. Remembrance day poppies. 10 more agreed previously, to contact charity. Extra-large cable ties needed.
- V. In Bloom purchases. £100 bulbs coming, 2 pots viewed to purchase. Councillors and public volunteers needed.
- VI. Cllr Evans queried Jacks Tea donation; missed out this time. Car boot cancelled as only 3 interested. White lines done. Ongo grass getting cut better.
- VII. Scarborough slag coming soon for CC carpark. Discussion ask Mr Carnaby to crush and smooth?; Cllr J. Hesketh and Cllr Hull to ask.
- VIII. 40 Ton HGVs coming into in village, Cllr Evans to ask KAAG about camera each end of village. Roundabout still going wrong way an issue, be aware. White markings/arrows requested.
